As a NHU student, you have access to thousands of journals and their articles online through our article databases. You also have access to an extensive collection of academic electronic books through *ebrary*.

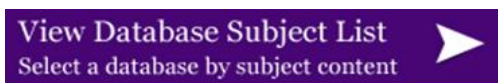
To access these resources, go to our library website at <http://library.nhu.edu>.

Alternatively, you can open the NHU Library website via the Quick Links on the University main webpage [www.nhu.edu](http://www.nhu.edu).

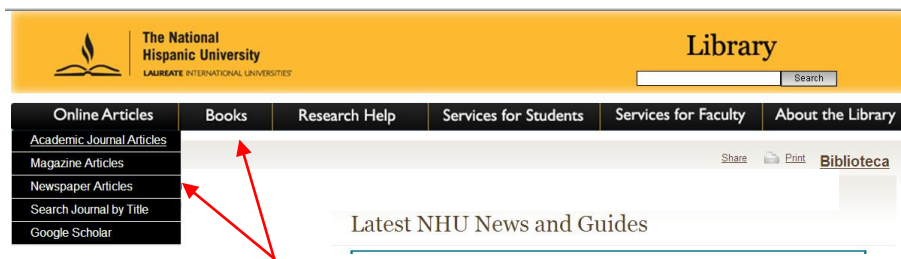
Once on the NHU Library website, locate these buttons to display the list of electronic resources available to you:

### [Academic Search Complete](#)

A multidisciplinary database containing journal, magazine and newspaper articles in the social sciences, humanities, general science, multi-cultural studies, education, and much more.

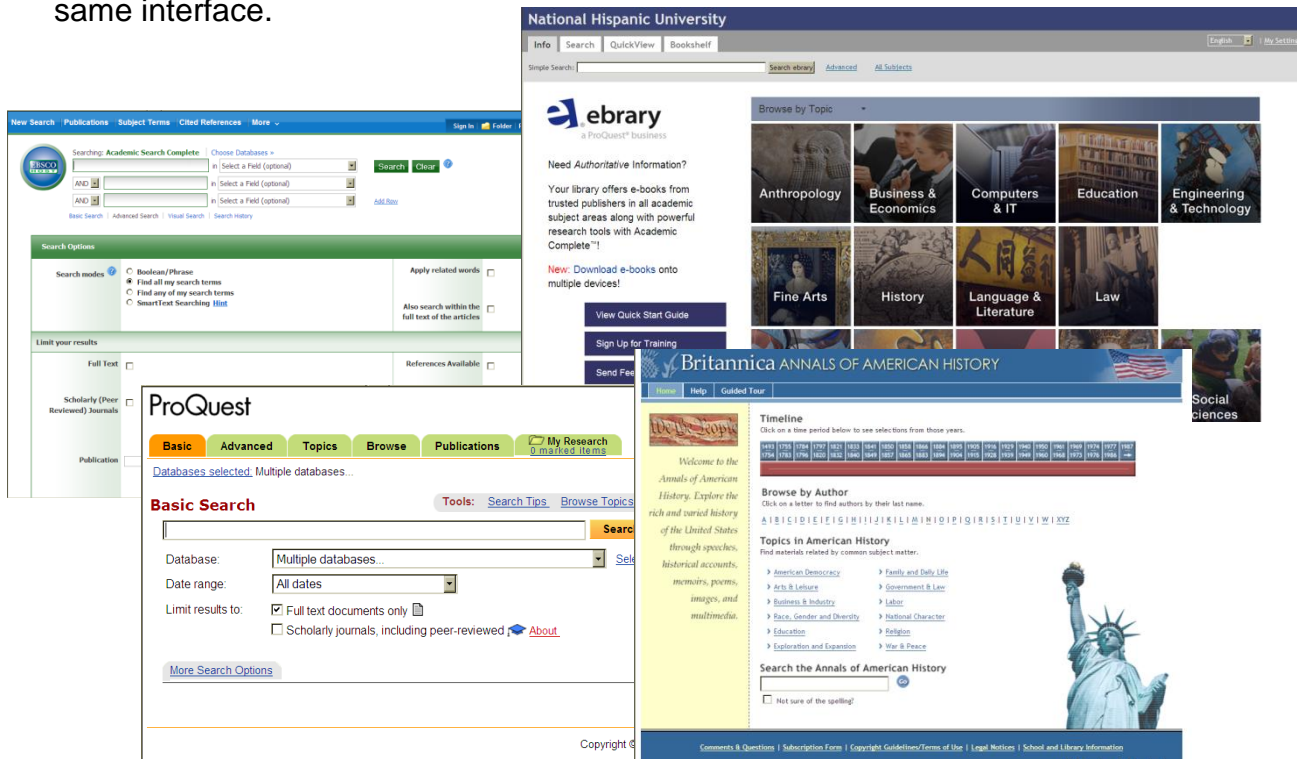
### [Business & Company Resource Center](#)

Bringing together a wide variety of global business information, including industry rankings, company performance ratings, investment reports, industry statistics, and comprehensive financial overviews.

The list of databases provides you with brief descriptions of the contents of these resources to help you choose the right database for your particular topic.

Clicking on any of these databases will take you to an authentication page. At this time, you will enter your MyNHU email address and password. If you cannot remember your MyNHU username and password, please contact your academic counselor or call 877-762-9801.

Each database will have a different look and feel since they are provided by different vendors. Some however, such as all of the databases provided by Ebsco, will have the same interface.
